English Week 2024/2025

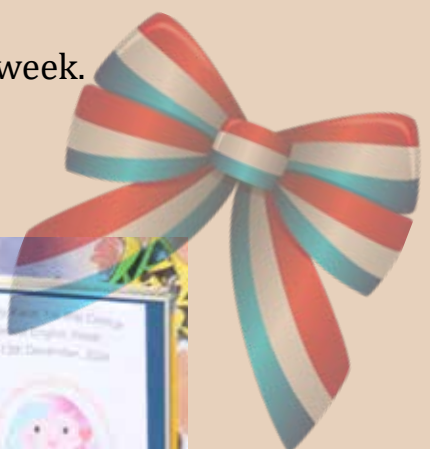

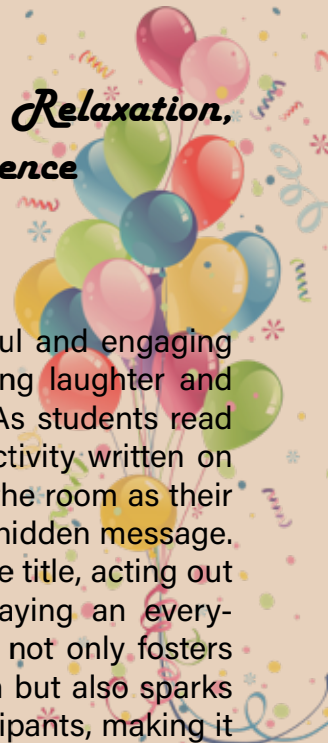

Six Game Booths about Rest, Relaxation, Relationships & Resilience



Booth 1: Act it Out
